Part III ALABAMIANS AGAINST SESSIONS FOR ATTORNEY GENERAL NAACP President Cornell William Brooks and Alabama NAACP President Benard Simelton to Join the Movement to Stop Sessions at a March/Rally in Mobile, AL

Mobile, AL—The Stop Sessions Movement Continues as NAACP President/CEO Cornell William Brooks joins the Alabama NAACP President Benard Simelton and the Mobile Branch President, Lizzetta McConnell for a March/Rally against the nomination/confirmation of Senator Jefferson Beauregard Sessions III for U.S. Attorney General.

Part III of Alabamians Against Sessions for Attorney General details a March/Rally which will begin Monday, January 30, 2017 at 12 noon located at 3900 College Lane South, Mobile, Al 36608. Marchers will lead us to Senator Jefferson Sessions office on 41 West Interstate 65 Service North, Mobile Al 36608 to make another request to withdraw his name from nomination.

“As an opponent of the vote, he can't be trusted to be the chief law-enforcement officer for voting rights,” said NAACP President/CEO Cornell William Brooks.

“This is too important for us to sit idly by and let our country turn back time. We have already been arrested for a civil disobedience demonstration once and we will certainly continue to exercise our constitutional rights,” said Alabama State Conference President Benard Simelton.

“He's been a threat to desegregation and the Voting Rights Act and remains a threat to all of our civil rights, including the right to live without the fear of police brutality,” added Simelton.”

“We need someone who will be a champion for all citizens. We will continue to protest and demonstrate as long as he faces the judiciary committee for the position of chief law-enforcement officer,” said President of Mobile Branch, Lizzetta McConnell.
